I found out last night that our amazing school has been added to the Schools' Rebuilding Scheme, and that our entire site on Evington Drive will be rebuilt, on a carbon-neutral basis. When I pushed the DfE a little harder, they said they would be very interested to learn a little more about the core principles of the Eco-Schools Movement, and this will again allow us to join with our international partners to bring innovation, 21st-Century design, and some of the best thinking from around the world. All of this will result in our new building reflecting the needs of our children, our community, and the world-class education we aim to provide. After everything our children have been through, this glittering prize is nothing less than what they deserve!!
