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#### **Bus Collection**

Despite there only being 9-more days of buses, we must always remain mindful of the Risk assessment that has been put in place. While I recognise that this has been a huge challenge all round, I am so pleased there have been no specific incidents involving our children. As we move into this final phase, I just want to remind you of the absolute importance of collecting your children on time. The buses start to come in from **15.45** and we are usually clear by **15.50**. Often staff are waiting with children until **16.15**, and the latest ever has been **17.40**. Staff are always tired at this time. They engage with the bus provision, despite this sitting well outside of their Job Descriptions, and we could not have done what we have done without their wonderful support. Connected to this is the efficient clearing of the playground once the buses have arrived. Some parents are chatting on the playground long after their children have arrived, and the supervisory requirement is somewhat blurred. After a long day at school, there will be nothing more your child could want than to get home, and be well-rested for whatever they will do next.

#### **Smart Watches**

Once again, it has been noted that a small number of children are bringing smart watches into school. This remains problematic because they can take photographs and even capture moving images. If these involve other children, our safeguarding procedures will have been broken, and this is something we cannot allow. If your child has a Smart Watch, please can you ensure that it remains at home? Thank you.

#### Governance

A vacancy has arisen on our Governing Body for what is known as a co-opted governor. A co-opted governor can join the board on the basis of the wider professional expertise that they possess. 
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
